Step 4

Cutting Instructions for Step 4

Background Fabric:

Cut 1 strip (21/4" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 4 (21/4" x 31/2") rectangles.

Cut 2 strips (1-3/8" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 8 (1-3/8" x 71/2") rectangles.

White Fabric:

Cut 1 strip (5" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 4 (5" x 5") squares,

Cut the squares diagonally twice;

Cut 1 strip (4½" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 8 (41/2" x 41/2") squares,

Cut these in half diagonally once.

Dark Blue Fabric:

Cut 1 strip (5" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 4 (5" x 5") squares,


Cut the squares diagonally twice;

Piecing for Step 4

Finish Red points

Unit 4-B

Sew a 21/4" x 31/2" Background strip to the point end of Unit 3-B and press the seam towards the Background strip. Label as Unit 4-A.



Sew a **1-3/8**" **x 7**½" Background strip to both sides of Unit 4-A and press to the Background Strip. Label as


Unit 4-B

Make Blocks G and G-RVS


Sew a Unit 2-B on the left side of 2 of Unit 4-B pieces. On the right of these 2 units sew a Unit 2-A. Press both seams to the Background strips. Label as Block G.

Sew a Unit 2-B on the right side of the other 2 Unit 4-B pieces. On the left side of these 2 units sew a Unit 2-A. Press both seams to the Background strips. Label as Block G-RVS.

Square all 4 blocks to 71/2", if needed.




Create Corner Pinwheels

Match a White triangle with a Dark Blue triangle (from the squares cut twice) and sew with RST. Begin stitching at the right angle going out to the point. Press the ¼" seam allowance to the Dark Blue triangle. Make **16** and label as Unit 4-C.






Lay out a Unit 4-C and a White Triangle (from the squares cut once) with RST. Sew together with a 1/4" seam and press the seams towards the Dark Blue Triangle. Make 16 and label them as Unit 4-D. Square to 4".



Place 4 Unit 4-D as pictured below. Sew together and press the seams in either direction. Label these as Block H. Square to 7½".
