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## Step 5

## Cutting Instructions for Step 5

## Background Fabric:

Cut 1 strip 3" by WOF; Sub-cut into 4 (3"x3") squares.

## Blue \#1

Cut 1 strip 13" by WOF;
Sub-cut into 3 (13"x13") squares.
From the remaining fabric cut 1 ( $13^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ ) square.
Blue \#2
Cut 7 strips 5" by WOF.

## Red

Cut 7 strips $11 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ by WOF.

## Piecing

- On the wrong side of 4 Background 3" squares, mark a diagonal line.

- Place a 3" Background square on one corner of a 13" Blue \#1 square with right sides together. Stitch on the marked line. Trim off the corner pieces to a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press the seam towards the Background fabric. Make 4 of these Unit 5-A.


Unit 5-A

- On the bottom edge of Unit 4-F, add a Unit 4-G. Press the seam towards Unit 4-F. Make 8 of these Unit 5-B. Square this to a 13 " square.

(Make 8)

Unit 5-B

- You have now completed all the blocks necessary to construct the center of the quilt. Using the Mystery Quilt Layout Diagram (see pg. 2), place the blocks in rows and stitch the rows together. Press the seams in the rows in opposite directions - odd number rows going in one direction, and even number rows going in the opposite direction to allow the seams of the rows to nest together.

You are now ready to add the borders.

- Measure the quilt length through the center of the quilt. Sew together Red strips and cut two strips equal to the length measurement. Add one of the strips to each side of the quilt.
- Measure the quilt width through the center of the quilt. Sew together Red strips and cut two strips equal to the width measurement. Add them to the top and bottom of the quilt.
- Again, measure the quilt through the center to determine the length needed for the outer border. Create the outer border pieces from Blue \#2 fabric and cut to the necessary measurement. Add them first to the left and right sides and Press the seam toward the outside. Repeat this process for the top and bottom borders.
