A five-part mystery quilt by **Sandy Berg** for Raspberry Bramble Designs

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Step 1

Cutting Instructions for Step 1

Background Fabric:

Cut 1 strip (5½" x Width of Fabric (WOF));

Sub-cut into 4 (5½" x 5½") squares;

From leftovers, cut 16 (21/4" x 21/4") squares.

Cut 2 strips (3" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 8 (3" x 101/2") strips.

Cut 1 strips (2" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 4 (2" x 101/2") strips.

Light Blue Fabric:

Cut 2 strips (11" x WOF");

Sub-cut into 4 (11" x 11") squares.

Save leftovers for later Steps.

Dark Blue Fabric:

Cut 2 strips (11" x WOF");

Sub-cut into 4 (11" x 11") squares.

From leftovers, cut 4 (21/4" x 101/2") strips.

Red Fabric:

Cut 3 strips (21/4" x WOF);

Sub-cut into 4 (21/4" x 101/2") strips,


4 (21/4" x 51/2") strips,

4 (21/4" x 71/4") strips.

Piecing for Step 1

Mark diagonal line on wrong side of squares.

4 Light Blue 11" squares.





Make 8 Half-Square Triangles (HST).

Place a marked Light Blue 11" square on top of an 11" Dark Blue square with right sides together (RST). Stitch a ¼" away from each side of the marked line and cut apart on the line making 2 HSTs each time. In half of the HSTs, press the seam towards the Dark Blue. In the other half of the HSTs, press to the Light Blue. Square them to 10½" and label as Unit 1-A.







Unit 1-A (Make 8)

. Make 4 of these units.

Add a (21/4" x 51/2") strip of Red to one side of a 51/2" square of Background. Press seam to the Red. Label as Unit 1-B.

(Make 4)

Unit 1-B

 Add a (7¼" x 2¼") strip of Red to an adjacent side of Unit 1-B. Press the seam towards the Red. Label as Unit 1-C. Make 4 of these.




Make 4 Dark Blue & 4 Red Pointed Strips.

On both ends of a Dark Blue (2¼" x 10½") strip, place a marked 2¼" Background square with the marked line going in opposite directions, as pictured. On each of the squares, stitch on the marked line and cut off the corners leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press to the colored fabric. Make 4.




 Repeat this process using Red (2½" x 10½") strips. Make 4.



Make 4 and label as Unit 1-D.

Join the Red and Blue strips with a $(2" \times 10\%")$ strip of Background in between. Press the seams to the colored strips. On each side of these units add $(3" \times 10\%")$ strips of Background. Press seams towards the colored fabrics. Square to 10%", if necessary.
